Affects of Government Shutdown

Arizona Snow Bowl and Aspen/Snowmass got the better of the feds when they chose to spin their lifts in spite of parks being shut down. At Aspen, management ran its Silver Queen gondola for free on October 12-13 to allow Aspen tourists, hoping to get to the Maroon Bells, an opportunity to enjoy fall foliage on the mountain, while Arizona Snow Bowl extended its scenic chair lift operation through those same dates. Tourists in both locations were afforded beautiful autumn views all the way around.

FIS World Cup Race Season Begins

October 26-27, 2013 will be the kick off to the World Cup season. The first race will be held in Soelden, Austria. The women's GS will be on October 26th, followed by the men's GS on October 27th. Tina Maze is the women's defending champion, while Ted Ligety is looking for a three-peat in the men's race. It is not known yet if Lindsey Vonn will compete in the season opener. She does plan, however, to be at the World Cup meeting in Beaver Creek, Colorado November 29-December 1.

SIA & NSAA Boards Unite in Washington

On September 24-25th, 2013, board members from SIA and NSAA joined forces in Washington, D.C. to discuss how to grow participation and to lobby around regulatory and trade issues currently affecting the snow sports industry. They spent the day on Capitol Hill, meeting with members of Congress and their key staff members focusing on Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act, Miscellaneous Tariff Bill, TSA Policy for Avalanche Air Bag Canisters, Water Rights for Land Resort and Immigration and Visas.

Board members were present at all of the Congressional visits, allowing both associations to appeal to Congress for support on critical issues affecting the Industry from a resort and product standpoint. "Time spent in Washington, educating public officials about the ski industry and our pressing concerns is incredibly valuable", said Michael Berry, NSAA president. "We were pleased to unite with SIA on delivering a powerful message in Washington about the impact that the ski industry has on the economy and jobs and our optimism for future success as well."

Women's Ski Jumping News

Lindsey Van won her 16th National Ski Jumping title October 13th in Lake Placid. Sixteen years ago, Lindsey moved to Lake Placid to live with her coach and his family while her hometown jumps in Park City were being rebuilt for the 2002 Salt Lake City Olympics. "Lake Placid will always hold a special place in my heart", she said after her win.

Jessica Jerome placed 2nd and Alissa Johnson placed 3rd in the downhill jump.

Sarah Hendrickson, reigning World Champion and 2013 large hill National Champion, sat out the weekend's events recovering from surgery after an August knee injury. In a recent interview, Sarah spoke of her injury and the rehabbing of it. "My goal of Sochi is 100-percent the reason I am getting out of bed in the morning and going to the gym for six hours a day. It is the reason I still have a smile on my face and it is the reason I will put my head down and fight through anything thrown at me in the next four months. I have dreamed of walking into the Opening Ceremony representing Team USA way too many times to give up now."

The Visa Team is now headed to training camp in Europe and then back for a short stint in Park City before heading to Lillehammer, Norway, for the World Cup opener on Dec. 6 (mixed-team event) and Dec. 7 (individual event). There are seven World Cup stops (14 events) before the start of the 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. The U.S. Olympic Trials for ski jumping takes place Dec. 29 in Park City; the winner gets an automatic spot on the Olympic Team. Remaining Olympic Team members (up to three more) will be announced mid-January.

Women Responsible for \$1B in Snow Sports Purchases

According to the 2013 Women's Snow Sports Market Intelligence Report, women are spending mega dollars on snow sport purchases each year, with 59% of their dollars going toward apparel. Sixty percent of female snow riders are in the 16 to 34 age range, and they all like to look good on the hill. According to the report, Alpine skiing brought out the most women, with a record 3.3 million women participating in the sport.

A small monitor inside the goggles allow you to look at your speed, elevation, music that's playing, your text messages, and even find emergency services. However, all this diverts your attention to what is really going on in front of you, and allowing you a chance to bail out of an accident that could be waiting to happen in front of you. If you are distracted, you place yourself and others at risk. So, have fun, but remember to ski and ride safely!
