As a frequent starter at league races, Dennis reminds everyone to have fun and be safe. He also advises first time racers that they get two runs, so to use the first run to get the feel of skiing gates before going all out on the second run. He also monitors racers at the start for helmet usage, loose clothing and checks to ensure that boots are buckled.

As National Ski Council Federation Vice President he chairs the Agenda Committee for the NSCF Annual Meeting. The 2013 agenda featured Jess McMillan as the keynote speaker for the annual NSCF meeting. Ms. McMillan's topic was being responsible for yourself and others.

She spoke about exercising responsibility by focusing on planning and conditioning before doing any extreme skiing. (She is a key note speaker at this year's FWSA Convention.)
