Ski trips, dive trips, and adventure trips abound. The annual Convention allows friends to gather for that once-a-year reunion to catch up with each other. They look toward the future with racing scholarships awarded each year to promising young athletes, and recognize those who are involved in ski history, environmental safety and skier safety, both on and off the mountain. HAPPY ANNIVERSARY: The *Unrecables*, a member club of Los Angeles Council of Ski Clubs, just turned 40. Founder, Ron Bass, who now resides on the Island of Maui, and leads drum circles at local beaches, got started with the Unrecables, with his mother's help and connections to *Daniel Freeman Hospital*. The hospital became sponsors of this new club that offered snow skiing to persons of all abilities. Ron went to *Sandy's Ski and Sport* in Marina Del Rey, and asked them if they would loan the club some rental skis for our trips. They said yes!! He began gathering instructors and people with disabilities who were interested, and the rest is history. The *Unrecables* is and has been an outstanding participating club with Far West for many years.

FIS WORLD CUP KICKS OFF: The 2021 World Cup Race is set for Saturday, October 17, in Sölden, Austria, where the world's best technical racers will pick up where they left off last March. One notable exception, will be *Mikaela Shiffrin*, who will be sitting this race out, due to tweaking her back in practice runs recently. She will rest this race, so better to be ready for the many races ahead.

U.S. SKI AND BOARD HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCEMENT: Eight ski and snow board athletes and sport builders were recently named to the 2020 US Ski and Board Hall of Fame. The eight include: the late *Howard Peterson*, leader and visionary of the U.S. Ski Team; *Holly Flanders*, Olympic downhill racer; ski area mastermind, *Brian Frank*; two-time Olympic Champion snowboarder *Seth Wescott*; long-time international ski federation and U.S. Ski Team leader, *Hank Tauber*; FIS Cross Country World Cup winner, *Alison Owen*; inventor of the THE ski, *Bobby Burns*; and U.S. Ski Team Freestyle Aerialist, *Kristean Porter*.

NEWS! FROM U.S. AIRLINE COMPANIES: A number of U.S. Airlines have waived their "change fees", which will result in a sizeable savings for those having to change their reserved flight in the U.S., Puerto Rico, and U.S. Virgin Islands. Effective immediately, for most Standard Economy, Economy and Premium fares on *United* and *Delta*, there will no longer be a "change fee". The downside...*United Airlines* will not give that partial refund, should your new flight be less than the original one. *Delta* states "if the new flight is cheaper, you will receive CREDIT for the price difference". Beginning January 1st, 2021, they will offer FREE (change) Same-Day Standby flights. *Alaska* and *American* are offering no change fees on some of their classes of fares. Check with your preferred airline for the most up-to-date information.

NEWS! SKI RESORTS STRUGGLE TO FILL ON-MOUNTAIN POSITIONS : Mountain and rural resorts for years, have relied on a steady stream of J-1 exchange visa workers from South America, Australia and New Zealand to staff ski schools, hotels and mountain operations. However, with President Trump's June 22 executive order, that paused all foreign-worker visas to expand opportunities for American workers, the challenge of landing seasonal workers has grown for ski areas that have long struggled to fill positions in remote — and pricey — mountain communities. Hiring enough temporary workers to fill crucial jobs, has become a real challenge. Currently, college kids are filling a critical gap for resort companies that need hundreds or even thousands of seasonal workers. "Our applications from college kids are up pretty significantly over prior years. We are targeting college-age applicants, but they seem to be targeting us as well. That's a bright light in this mess", said Jim Laing, head of human resources of *Aspen Skiing Company*. *Vail Resorts*, which owns 33 ski areas in the U.S. and has historically relied on foreign workers, is recruiting more aggressively in local communities. The college students, who have more flexibility, because they are learning remotely or are taking a gap year because of the pandemic, could be the answer to a lot of prayers from the ski resorts this season.
